Now, much of its land sits abandoned or in disrepair, its waterways are polluted, but its potential is immense.



The **Harbor District Initiative** brings together local, state, and federal government efforts, private sector interests, and community enthusiasm to achieve a world-class revitalization of this area for the benefit of the City and the Region. Our goal is to reinforce existing businesses and neighborhoods and set a new standard for how waterfronts “work” environmentally, economically, and socially.

Over the next 18 to 24 months, the Harbor District Initiative will conduct a planning process to engage a broad array of stakeholders in crafting a vision for the area, and will begin to build momentum and marshal resources to implement the vision.


